PLACEMENT TESTS FOR WRITING FOR SUCCESS NOW AVAILABLE ON THE NOVEL IDEAS WEBSITE



Thank you to the many of you who have provided feedback on the success of your students with the Writing for Success program. Many of you are seeing students move from reluctant to eager writers. Some of you have commented on how much the lessons have helped you, as a teacher, feel more confident teaching writing. You mentioned that the rubrics gave you feedback that you can use to help students improve specific aspects of their writing. Using the rubrics as part of targeted remediation and giving students the opportunity to do a second write with the scored rubric has resulted in a much higher level of writing.

We have had several requests for the placement tests for this program, so we are posting them online on the <u>Novel Ideas website</u>. There are scripted test instructions (provides consistency for administering the test) with a writing prompt. A scoring rubric is provided that you can use to score each student's piece of writing. Placement testing recommendations based on the student's score are provided.


PLACEMENT TESTS FOR OTHER PROGRAMS



The Hobbit


The Hobbit takes students on a hero quest that involves high fantasy and adventure.




Anne Frank: The Diary of a Young Girl

Animal Farm

Animal Farm appears to be a story about farm animals rebelling against humans. However, this story is a political satire/allegory/fable. It is a commentary on Stalin's Soviet Russia after World War II. The novel study provides students with strategies for understanding who the characters are within a historical context—something that makes this novella complex. This study compliments social studies curriculum that covers this period of history.


